R85/21	Appointment of a Chairman for the meeting In the absence of the Chairman, It was Resolved that Cllr. Lawton chair the meeting.
R86/21	Apologies for Absence Apologies received from Cllr. Hill, Cllr. Cook, Cllr. Pullen, Cllr. Forder-Stent
R87/21	Dispensations under Section 33 of Localism Act 2011 No dispensation requests were received.
R88/21	Declarations of Interest There were no declarations made.
R89/21	Approval of Minutes It was Resolved that minutes of the meeting of the Recreation Committee held on the 17 th March 2022 be approved and signed.
R90/21	Public Representation John Paine, Twyford Cricket Club, advised that he had reported a play equipment fault at Hunter Park to the Clerk and would be happy to answer any questions regarding the request by the cricket club for BBQs.
R91/21	Assistant Clerk's Report The report was noted and is attached in the appendices. The Clerk also advised that tree works at Northfields adjacent to the B3335 were to take place the following day.
R92/21	Maintenance List The report was received , and no further additions requested. Members did query the criteria for prioritisation and the perception of how this may appear in terms of working through the list in a timely manner. The Clerk also advised that one option to be considered is that playground minor works could be carried out by a play area professional which could address most of this work in a single session.
R93/21	Spring works at Hunter Park The Clerk reported that Cllr. Pullen had arranged for the Beech hedging to be planted, 4 new trees in the southern corner planted, and wildflower beds had been prepared and sow.

	The Clerk was arranging for soaker hosing for the beech hedging and wood chip to discourage weed growth and the ground drying out.
R94/21	<p>Dogs in Hunter Park</p> <p>Members considered the issue of dogs and in particularly dog fouling in Hunter Park. The was a general feeling from members directly and through views expressed to them by members of the public and hirers of the park facilities that there had been a significant issue in the amount of dog fouling that was not being picked up.</p> <p>Following a lengthy debate, it was Resolved:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • That the Clerk would arrange for additional signs, which included information on how to report issues to the WCC Dog Warden. • A notice in the noticeboard advising that the Parish Council is reviewing the dog situation in Hunter Park. • The Clerk will investigate provision of dog waste bags.
R95/21	<p>Picnic benches in Hunter Park</p> <p>Members considered a report and options for picnic benches, including those suitable for wheelchair users. All the options quoted for were constructed from recycled plastic material similar to the recently installed benches.</p> <p>It was Resolved to Recommend to Full Council, the purchase of 1 “Clifton” picnic table with wheelchair access at £725.47 and 1 “Clifton” regular picnic bench at £571.87.</p>
R96/21	<p>Visual Tree Assessments</p> <p>The reports for Hunter Park and Northfields were received and noted.</p> <p>The Clerk advised that there is significant ash dieback at Northfields which would require further work. The only critical issues identified in the report was at Northfields which was addressed by contractors the following day.</p>
R97/21	<p>Allotments</p> <p>The report from the Assistant Clerk was received and noted. Members thanked the officers for their work on managing the allotment site which was looking in very condition.</p>
R98/21	<p>Request for barbecues in Hunter Park</p> <p>Members considered the request by Twyford Cricket Club. The proposal by the cricket club was for weekly barbecues during the Friday evening Allstars youth sessions and would raise funds for the club.</p> <p>General use of barbecues in the park is not permitted, although permission for organised events can be considered.</p> <p>Members were supportive in principle but were concerned at the number of occasions being proposed. Following the conclusion of the cricket season, the matter could be reviewed at future Recreation Committee meeting.</p> <p>It was Resolved that permission be granted for the barbecue event on the 3rd September 2022 and that during the period of Allstar sessions, 20th May 2022 to 22nd July that permission is granted for these barbecue events to be held on about a fortnightly basis. The club would liaise with the Clerk on the actual dates.</p>

Assistant Clerk's Report

General updates

1) Allotments:

- The first of the bi-monthly allotment inspections took place on 21st April. Reported elsewhere on the Agenda
- Residents on the waiting list have been contacted to ascertain their continued interest to remain on the waiting list. There are currently 8 residents on the list.
- Invoices for 2022/23 were sent out at the beginning of April and included the voluntary maintenance levy.
- David Lea and helpers held a successful bonfire mid-April.
- The revised Allotment Gardens Guidance document has been circulated to tenants.
- Greensmiles have been contracted to carry out the work on the main paths and bonfire area at a cost of £30 per strim, envisaged to take place every 4/6 weeks from May to September.

2) Hunter Park:

- The new benches are now installed at Hunter Park.
- The sandpit was filled ready for the Easter holidays and woodchip was added to the play area.
- The cricket covers are in the process of being repaired. Shorelands Network Solutions have said they will store the cricket covers in the south-eastern corner of Hunter Park next winter to help prevent further storm damage.
- Football matches have now ended, and the cricket season has commenced. Ad hoc football training will continue.
- A successful children's holiday camp ran during the Easter holidays using both the Pavilion and Hunter Park.

3) Hunter Park Pavilion

- On 25th April 2022 the cleaner found the community room to be flooded. Assistant Clerk liaised with Caretaker who attended and organised a plumber to replace the isolation valve in time for a private booking on 26th April.
- The defibrillator unit at Hunter Park is showing signs of a low battery. The unit was serviced early 2021 for the same problem, therefore, Welmedical have agreed to investigate again. A loan unit has been provided.
