#### What's Going on in Berry Meadow?

The trees are now planted in Berry Meadow in individual enclosures to protect them from cattle grazing.

There are thirty of them - 16 alternate beech and small leafed lime in the Avenue along the Shawford Road and, in the clump at the Norris Bridge end, 5 disease resistant elm and 9 alder.

The idea for tree planting on Parish land came from the Green Fair 18 months ago. The Parish Council took up the idea and decided on big trees rather than little ones and to use them in a more formal design.

By chance the South Downs National Park (SDNP) were promoting tree planting via grants, so TPC applied and have been given these trees and a contribution to the cost of the guards. A contractor was employed to drive in the 120 posts for the tree guards. Volunteers have done the rest - dug the holes, planted the trees, screwed 360 rails in place and wrapped barbed wire around the lower two rails. Mulch will now be put around each tree.

The total cost is about £4600. SDNP have paid for the trees and £1500 towards the guards; £500 is to come from Twyford Charity and the rest from the Parish Council.

Many thanks to all those who have contributed and helped.

The training is run by SCA (South Central Ambulance Charity) and will cover finding the patient, calling 999, the recovery position, CPR, using the defibrillator unit etc.



## **60th Anniversary of Hunter Park Fun Day**

Twyford Parish Council is organising a fun day to celebrate the 60th Anniversary of Hunter Park, which was officially opened by Lord Ashburton on 25th April 1964.

Mr Hugh Rudolph Hunter donated a large section of the park in August

1962. The donated land adjoined an area already owned by the Parish Council and the park we know today was created and named after Mr Hunter.

The Parish Council has maintained Hunter Park ever since and have recently made several improvements including new equipment and upgrades to the children's play area and improved footpaths around the park as well as creating a wild flower meadow above the football pitch.

## What does the Parish Council do?

Twyford Parish Council is currently made up of 13 Councillors who live in the village and are all **volunteers**, giving up their time to support the village residents by acting as a voice for the local community. Key tasks include:

- Overseeing the governance of the parish
- Managing the finances of the Parish Council
- Engaging with residents, businesses, and community groups
- Reviewing planning applications within the parish boundary and providing comments or recommendations to SNDP and other local planning authorities based on the interests of the community.

- Maintenance of Parish owned land including Hunter Park, Northfields Play Area, Berry Meadows, The Meads and the Locks
- Managing the allotments, Speed Limit Reminder Signs, dog waste and rubbish bins on Parish Council owned land, maintaining the bus shelters, some public footpath maintenance
- Representing the village's interests and concerns to higher authorities such as the local government, other public bodies or commercial operations such as Southampton Airport and Southern Water.

The Parish Councillors are supported by the Clerk and Assistant Clerk.

We currently have 2 councillor vacancies, if you are interested in learning more, please let the Parish Clerk know.
